PRESENT: Jefferson Riley, Lisa Dunn, Perry Lunsford, Helen Robertson, Bryan Hale, Chris Fulmer

The honorable-mayor Jefferson R Riley called the meeting to order and immediately asked the Council for a Motion to Revise or Approve the Agenda. Councilman Chris Fulmer made the Motion to approve the agenda and the honorable-mayor-pro tem Perry Lunsford gave the Second. All Council voted 'aye' and the Motion Passed.

Councilwoman Helen Robertson gave the invocation and lead everyone present in the pledge.

The honorable-mayor Jefferson R Riley welcomed everyone to the meeting and made a few announcements. The first announcement he made was to let everyone know that the City's purchase of 3089 Hwy 11 was complete on May 31st. He then announced that the Mansfield Methodist Church sanctuary, that is 114 years old, has to be demolished. The structure of the church is unsafe. The church plans to rebuild the sanctuary back with a wood siding type look instead of brick. This is much like the original structure, that was wood. When this process begins to happen, sometime in August 2017, some of the surrounding streets will need to be closed temporarily. He also announced that the new flow meter for the Sewer Treatment plant is scheduled to be installed and calibrated on Thursday, June 15th.

Mr. Mike Evans, 75 Kellogg Ave, commented that he is still looking for a speedhump to be put down below his house on the property line. Mr. Evans said he could block his side of the right-of-way in response to the mayor's comment of looking for the best area to place the speedhump, that would not allow cars to drive around it onto the grassy right-of-way. The honorable-mayor also asked Mr. Evans how he would block his side, to which he answered by a fence or large rock. Mayor-pro Tem Perry Lunsford said he and John Napoli, the City's Public Works supervisor, looked for the best place and the most natural place is one property up the road where there is a stump on one side and a light pole on the other. Mr. Evans felt this would not be an effective area.

Mrs. June Crenshaw, 524 Kellogg Ave, said thank you for cutting the right of way of her yard. She said it looks like they are a part of the town.

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Mr. Blair Northen, 3800 Hwy 213, asked if the City annexed the new Blackwell property and what was the purpose of it. The honorable-mayor Jefferson R Riley responded because they asked to be annexed. Mr. Northen then asked if there was a cost incurred by the City for annexing the Blackwell property? The mayor answered that there were no costs incurred and that the City would get water/wastewater revenue from the annexation. Mr. Northen then commented that a new vehicle purchase is a much better option for the City but felt a diesel would be a poor choice. Mr. Northen's last comment was directed to the issue of the Bed & Breakfast discussion from previous meetings, he said the property was not big enough and that there is no reason for people to come to Mansfield. He also felt it would be a burden to Highway 213, would not generate additional tax revenue, it was next to the school, and there would be a number of cars. He asked mayor and council to ask themselves, 'what good will it provide to the City?'

Mrs. Brenda Campbell, 3809 Hwy 213, asked what the City's plans were for the building it just purchased. Why did we buy it, etc.? The honorable mayor asked Councilman Chris Fulmer to respond. Councilman Fulmer said it was a good purchase for the City and that there were no defined plans at this time. The purchase was an investment for the City and it would recoup the costs, etc., if or when sold. Mrs. Campbell then asked if we could get Rooster's to move their sign, please, you cannot see around it to turn onto Highway 11. Councilman Bryan Hale asked what the GaDOT right of way is.

Mr. Paul Campbell, 3809 Hwy 213, asked what was to stop someone from doing the same with the Bed & Breakfast as was planning with the Harris building before the City purchased it? The honorable-mayor responded, Planning & Zoning.

Mrs. Deborah Riley, 401 Sewell Rd, said there are rumors going around about her daughter buying the Harris building. She said they have looked but that is all.

The honorable-mayor-pro tem Perry Lunsford made a Motion to approve the tree removal from 32 Ivy St for a cost of up to \$2,200. Councilman Chris Fulmer gave the Second. Mayor-pro tem Perry Lunsford suggested the City Clerk to get a third bid from Arbor Equity since the City could only get 2 bids. All Council voted 'aye'. The Motion Passed.

The honorable-mayor-pro tem Perry Lunsford made the Motion to approve the FY2017 – 2018 Budget as presented. Councilwoman Helen Robertson gave the Second. All Council voted 'aye'. The Motion Passed.

The honorable-mayor Jefferson Riley commented at this time that there was an issue with Bryan Hale's variance request, the City Charter requires it to go to the Planning Commission first. Mayor-pro tem Perry Lunsford asked for a Point-of-Order on the Resolution for the Moratorium Extension. He asked if it was from today or from the

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previous Moratorium. The City Clerk answered that it was from tonight's meeting. The honorable-mayor Jefferson R Riley reminded everyone that a Motion and a Second was needed for discussion to begin. Councilman Chris Fulmer made a Motion that the City continue the moratorium with exception of the variance request since it was in place before the first moratorium pending the City Attorney's approval. Mayor-pro tem Perry Lunsford gave the Second. Councilwoman Lisa Dunn asked what happens if the Motion passes and the City Attorney says "no". Upon checking with the City Attorney via text, the City Clerk asked him, "Can we make an exception for a variance request to allow a person to go before the PC on Thursday, that was requested before 1st moratorium? To allow the request?" The City Attorney, Scott Cole, responded with "Yes. It was pending through the initial moratorium. New moratorium is on new applications." Councilman Fulmer amended his Motion to exclude "pending the City Attorney's approval". Mayor-pro tem Perry Lunsford gave the Second. The honorable-mayor Jefferson R Riley asked Councilman Bryan Hale to recuse himself from the vote. All Council voted 'aye'. The Motion Passed.

The honorable-mayor-pro tem Perry Lunsford made the Motion to approve the Resolution for Highway 11 Scenic Byway. Councilman Bryan Hale gave the Second. All Council voted 'aye'. The Motion Passed.

Mayor-pro tem Perry Lunsford made the Motion to approve the recommendation by Electric Cities of Georgia's new water/wastewater rates. Councilman Chris Fulmer gave the Second. There was a lengthy discussion by council concerning the rate increase. The following are some highlights from the discussion: Councilwoman Lisa Dunn asked several questions about items in the FY2017-2018 Water/Sewer Budget that could possibly be cut to offset some of the increase. Councilman Bryan Hale said it was a humongous jump at one time. Councilwoman Helen Robertson said "since the City has been losing money all along, can we split up the hike and just lose a little longer?" The honorable-mayor Jefferson R Riley answered the City Council can do whatever it wants to do. Vote the motion down and make a new motion or withdraw the motion. The mayor-pro tem Perry Lunsford stated that we could ask ECG to give us a new rate structure to increase over time. The honorable-mayor Jefferson R Riley stated that the citizen's elect people to represent them to make these hard decisions. Councilman Chris Fulmer stated that there has been plenty of time to think about this and sees no alternative and wants to act responsibly. At this time the honorable-mayor-pro tem Perry Lunsford called the question. Councilman Chris Fulmer gave the Second. Councilwoman Helen Robertson voted 'No', Councilman Bryan Hale voted 'No', and Councilwoman Lisa Dunn voted 'No'. Councilman Chris Fulmer voted 'Yes' and Mayorpro tem Perry Lunsford voted 'Yes'. The Motion Failed.

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Councilwoman Helen Robertson made a Motion that we accept ECG's rate recommendation but apply the increase 50% this year and 50% next year. Mayor-pro tem Perry Lunsford gave the Second. Councilman Bryan Hale and Councilwoman Lisa Dunn voted 'No'. Councilman Chris Fulmer, Councilwoman Helen Robertson and Mayor-pro tem Perry Lunsford voted 'Yes'. The Motion Passed.

Councilwoman Lisa Dunn made a Motion to table the dump truck purchase approval until the next meeting. Councilman Chris Fulmer gave the Second. All Council voted 'aye'. The Motion Passed.

The honorable-mayor-pro tem Perry Lunsford made a Motion to move into Executive Session. Councilman Chris Fulmer gave the Second. All Council voted 'aye'. The Motion Passed.

Executive Session minutes are in a sealed envelope labeled "June 12, 2017 Executive Session Minutes" and stored in a pre-determined secured area at Mansfield City Hall.

Councilman Bryan Hale made the Motion to leave Executive Session and re-enter into the Regular Council Meeting. Mayor-pro tem Perry Lunsford gave the Second. All Council voted "aye". The Motion Passed.

The honorable-mayor pro tem Perry Lunsford made a Motion for the City to purchase 3201 Hwy 11 property for \$31,500 with sellers paying the closing costs and the City allowing them 45 days to vacate premises after closing. Councilwoman Helen Robertson gave the Second. All Council voted 'aye'. The Motion Passed.

RESOLUTION

A RESOLUTION DECLARING A MORATORIUM ON THE FILING OF OR ACCEPTANCE OF APPLICATIONS FOR AMENDMENTS TO THE ZONING ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF MANSFIELD, GEORGIA, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, the Governing Authority of the City of Mansfield is tasked with protecting the City's public health, safety, and general welfare; and

WHEREAS, the Mansfield City Council is preparing an update to the Official Zoning Map; and

WHEREAS, the Mansfield City Council recognizes there may be last-minute efforts to race through the gamut of zoning and/or permit procedures to exploit the delays inherent in the legislative process; and

WHEREAS, the Mansfield City Council desires to ensure the continued protection of individuals' property from unpermitted uses is balanced with need to adopt an updated Official Zoning Map; and

WHEREAS, the Mansfield City Council desires to provide a temporary stopgap measure to delay the consideration of applications to amend the zoning ordinance and/or applications for issuing certain permits until the City Council can adopt an updated Official Zoning Map; and

WHEREAS, the Mansfield City Council must take immediate and responsive action to protect the interests of residents of the City of Mansfield and it is in the best interests of the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of Mansfield that no new applications for zoning amendments or applications for building permits for within the City's limits be accepted by the City for forty-five (45) days, while the Mansfield City Council adopts an updated Official Zoning Map; and

WHEREAS, the Mansfield City Council finds that pending adoption of the updated Official Zoning Map, a moratorium on filing or accepting applications for an amendment to the zoning ordinance or for building permits as described in this Resolution is the least restrictive means available in exercising its police power to protect the public health, safety and welfare of the citizens of Mansfield.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AND IT IS DECLARED BY THE MAYOR AND MANSFIELD CITY COUNCIL AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. From approval of this Resolution, notwithstanding any provision of the Code of the City of Mansfield to the contrary, there will be a complete moratorium on filing or accepting any application for an amendment to the Zoning Ordinance or application for a building permit. The boundaries of the property affected by this moratorium will include the entire area within the City Limits of the City of Mansfield, Georgia.
- 2. The moratorium imposed incorporates the findings and statements set forth in the preceding "Whereas" clauses and such clauses are made a part of this moratorium.
- 3. This moratorium will expire at midnight on the day forty-five (45) days from the Effective Date, and be of no force and effect, unless shortened or extended by official action of the Mansfield City Council.
- 4. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or other portion of this Resolution, or its application to any person, entity or circumstance, is held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be unconstitutional or invalid, the remainder of the Resolution, or application of the provision to other persons, entities or circumstances will not be affected.

A RESOLUTION OF SUPPORT FOR THE HIGHWAY 11 SCENIC BY-WAY

WHEREAS, the Newton County Development Services has identified a route that follows State Route Highway 11, which contains significant scenic, natural, historic, cultural, archeological or recreational qualities;

WHEREAS, Newton County Development Services is seeking to gain "Georgia Scenic By-Way" designation for the route from the Georgia Department of Transportation;

WHEREAS, the City of Mansfield has been advised on details of the Georgia Scenic By-Ways Program, the proposed by-way, and the benefits of designation;
